The fourth Thursday free-sew time at Central Lutheran will include TWO special presentations:

- Glenda Burk will demonstrate how she portrays buildings in her quilts. She says she will have some supplies, and those quilters who want to can bring their own upholstery fabric or other (like home dec fabric) to work with. This will be helpful to quilters who are preparing street scenes for the Centennial Challenge. Anyone interested should bring a picture or idea of what building they are wanting to make. Most of the work is with drawing, cutting and pressing, but she will also bring her sewing machine to aid in the demonstration.
- Sandy Winfree is demonstrating her patterns and methods for doll making. She will share techniques and let you try her tools (before you buy your own). She is a veteran doll maker, and is very enthusiastic after seeing the presentation on March 20th. A list of supplies for Sandy's demo/class is included inside the newsletter.

Come prepared to attend one of the special demonstrations, or just enjoy sewing on your own as usual.

 Also, 37-38 fleece blankets were made. There were more larger-sized quilts and more quilts appropriate for men made this year. Particularly enthusiastic were recipients AWAIC and Jesse Lee Home. Information will be in the newsletter. The next work day will be May 29 with lunch provided. No one will be collecting quilts at the next meeting.
- <u>Library</u>—Darlene Appel thanked Linda Postlethwait for subbing during the winter and for Margaret's list for the Centennial Quilt Project. New DVDs in the library: *Three Stitch Imagery, Color Theory Made Easy, Rebel Quilting,* and more ordered. Also have *Uncovering* (historical, bottom shelf). New books: Sweatshirt patterns, quilting geometric patterns, reproductions (Civil War), *Brave New Quilts* (modern), *Quilt National 2013* (great for art quilts).
- <u>Library Exhibit</u>—Linda Postlethwait thanked helpers who put up and took down the show. Quilts were ready for pick-up in the back of the church.
- <u>Small Quilting Groups</u>--Marilyn Galbraith reported a new art group with Pat Sims as spokesperson. Times will be set up for an organizational meeting.
- <u>Programs</u>—Barbara Clinton reported there are some openings for programs. Next program is the Small Quilt
 Auction slide show. Future programs include "Where in the World?" with Carol Baker and Delberta Trevithick.
 (Where have you been and gotten inspiration?) Volunteers needed to share. Also a possibility is a June Studio Hop.
 (Need 4 or 5 people willing to host at their studios and a car-pool coordinator). Barbara also presented Linda
 Postlethwait with "A Cut Above" headband award!
- Teddy Bear Tea and Quilts—Mary Dodge advised the expense report was given to the Board this A.M.
- Small Quilt Auction—Kaye Baehr reminded members that their Library Exhibit quilt could fit into the Auction.
- Retreat—Committee member Barbara Clinton reported the committee is working. Retreat is May 15-18. Member Mary Gerken reported lots of donations for the goody bags have been collected.
- <u>Centennial Exhibit</u>—Marilyn Moreno announced that so far 49 quilts are in the works. The decades still sparse are 1925-34 (2 only) and 1995-04 (2 only). Some hard copies of quilt information will be available next meeting. Needed also is a log cabin quilt for the Pioneer area. Reported also was that the library has a banner with ALCQ. Other quilts celebrating Anchorage—anything—will be in the Quilt Show. <a href="Note: FYI concerning questions about selling your Centennial Exhibit quilts—Talk with the President and other Board members about solutions.
- Quilt Show—Marilyn Moreno advised that forms and sign-ups are near. Get ready for a blurb on why your
 Centennial quilt is meaningful to you—put it on the computer. Peggy Brewer will accept challenge quilts on July 1.
 For small quilting groups—one table per group.

Announcements: Judy Crosby is looking for a bag with Dresden plate templates and fabric.

Meeting was adjourned at 11:24, followed by birthday names (27!), cake, tips, and show and tell.

4th Thursday Doll Class

Hi doll maker wannabees! Join me on the 4th Thursdays (during open sew) at the church for doll making. Bring:

- 1. Fabric, about 5/8 yard if you want to do the whole body in flesh (Seams Like Home on Lake Otis has a great selection of flesh tones in Kona Cotton, as ice peach) or less if you want to bring other fabrics for the body, legs, arms. If you just want the face and hands in flesh bring about a fat quarter's worth. Brings THREADS to match fabrics. Sometimes many hands have to be made as the stitching blows out when stuffing, or a face needs to be remade if you are not happy with it.
- 2. Polyester stuffing
- 3. Tracing paper if you want to take any patterns from books home.
- 4. If you have any small narrow fork, as a pickle fork, that helps in stuffing large areas.
- 5. Usual sewing supplies of sewing machine, sewing needles, small scissors.
- 6. 4 plain buttons with 2 holes for sewing arms and legs on.
- 7. Stitch Witchery tape if you want to apply any lace, trim directly to body parts, without sewing it on. Note: you can't use this with lace that has sequins or beads.
- 8. Lace, decorative thread, hot fix crystals that you might want to apply to body parts before sewing or stuffing.
- 9. Package of white pipe cleaners for fingers. You need one per finger.
- 10. Any of the supplies I am bringing if you have them, please.

I'm still exploring hair fibers, so don't want to recommend any at the moment.

I will bring to share: 2 books that have patterns, a good beginner's pattern of a lady doll for you to trace onto cloth to begin with, colored pencils, Prisma pens, turning tubes and rods for turning hands and other pieces inside out, a stuffing fork small enough for hands, noses, a couple of pickle forks, pliers, 6" needles for sewing arms and legs on, hot fix crystal iron, needle felting needles, white paint for eyes and brushes, paint for fingernails, iron, and ironing pad.


