#### **Online Spinning and Weaving** Classes

I recently found a new website called "Craftsy" (http:// www.craftsy.com) which has a variety of recorded classes online. They cover a lot of "craft" topics including spinning and weaving. They have a FREE class taught by Deborah Robson, author of The Fleece and Fiber Sourcebook: More than 200 Fibers from Animal to Spun Yarn. The free class is called Know Your Wool and is an excellent overview of how different wool breed characteristic affect yarn and anything made from yarn. This is considered a mini-class since it is short at 84 minutes long. It is an excellent opportunity to learn more about sheep breeds from an expert and also to see if the online learning experience works for you.

I thought the production quality was very good, having quality visual, sound, various helpful camera angles, good editing and nothing annoying. I liked how you can take notes and it will pause the presentation for you. I like the handouts with their notes, references, resources and project info. I really liked the Q&A (called Talk) from other students. There was great discussion

around the topic. Normally in a paid class the instructor will actively participate in the Q&A too. This is not the same as taking a class in person, but is a step above watching available instructional DVDs. I look forward to seeing more classes in their lineup.

You must create an account to get this (or paid) classes. With the account you always have access to your classes, notes, etc. You can repeat the whole class or specific sections. It also remembers where you left off making it easy to take the class over multiple sessions or handle interruptions.

Nearly every morning, rain or shine, more than a dozen Anchorage men and women meet to walk together in Northeast Anchorage.

They're the Northway Mall Walker's Club. Many of them have walked there for more than a decade and traveled thousands of miles through the mall's atriums and hall-ways, and they're just one part of the long-established Alaskan community within the mall. When the shops open later in the morning, store employees greet customers by name, and neighborhood families make Northway a regular destination.

The mall community grew when it added several new retail businesses and restaurants over the past six months, and most recently with the addition of a public art gallery featuring student work by local youth. Now, the community continues to grow with the addition of the Art Market.

The market is a commercial venue for local Alaskan artists and crafters of all mediums to display and sell their work: Tables and kiosks are available for rent Friday through Sunday year-round, and special rates are available for monthly, bi-annual and annual reservations. It's Alaska's only indoor arts & crafts market catering specifically to handmade, locally produced work and located in a full-scale shopping center.

It's also an opportunity to showcase Alaska's diverse artistic traditions, a new kind of shopping experience for the mall's established customer community and a rich addition to Anchorage's retail and cultural outlets.
